
Forest Ridge Book Group



January 10 *The Lincoln Highway* by Amor Towles

In June, 1954, eighteen-year-old Emmett Watson is driven home to Nebraska by the warden of the juvenile work farm where he has just served fifteen months. Emmett's intention is to pick up his eight-year-old brother, Billy, and head to California. However, Emmett discovers that two friends from the work farm have escaped and together they make a new plan for the future.

February 14 *The It Girl* by Ruth Ware

April Clarke-Cliveden was the first person Hannah Jones met at Oxford. Together, they cultivated a group of inseparable friends during their first term. By the end of the second, April was dead. As Hannah reconnects with old friends and delves deeper into the mystery of April's death, she realizes that the friends she thought she knew all have something to hide.

March 14 *The Hotel Nantucket* by Elin Hilderbrand

The Hotel Nantucket descended from a gilded age gem to a mediocre budget-friendly lodge to inevitably an abandoned eyesore -- until it's purchased and renovated by London billionaire, Xavier Darling. Xavier hires Lizbet Keaton as his general manager, and Lizbet, pulls together a staff who share the vision of turning the hotel around.

April 11 *The Paris Apartment* by Lucy Foley

Jess needs a fresh start. Her half-brother Ben didn't sound thrilled when she asked if she could crash with him for a bit, but he didn't say no, and surely everything will look better from Paris. When she arrives at the apartment Ben is missing and everyone is a suspect.

May 9 *Mexican Gothic* by Silvia Moreno-Garcia

After receiving a frantic letter from her newly-wed cousin begging for someone to save her from a mysterious doom, Noemí Taboada heads to High Place, a distant house in the Mexican countryside. She becomes mesmerized by the terrifying yet seductive world of High Place, and may soon find it impossible to ever leave this enigmatic house behind

June 13 *The Maid* by Nita Prose

Molly Dunn struggles with social skills and interprets people literally. Since her Gran died a few months ago, twenty-five-year-old Molly has had to navigate life's complexities all by herself. No matter--she throws herself with gusto into her work as a hotel maid. Molly's odd demeanor has the police targeting her as their lead suspect of a homicide and she finds herself in a web of subtext and nuance she has no idea how to untangle.

July 11 *Violeta* by Isabel Allende

The ripples of the Great War are still being felt, even as the Spanish flu arrives on the shores of her South American. As the Great Depression transforms the genteel city life she has known, Violeta's family loses all and is forced to retreat to a wild and beautiful but remote part of the country. Her life will be shaped by some of the most important events of history: the fight for women's rights, the rise and fall of tyrants, and, ultimately, not one but two pandemics.

August 8 *The Good Left Undone* by Adriana Trigiani

Domenica Cabrelli journey takes her from the rocky shores of Marseille to the mystical beauty of Scotland to the dangers of wartime Liverpool--as she experiences love, loss, and grief while she longs for home. A hundred years later, her daughter, Matelda, and her granddaughter, Anina, face the same big questions about life and their family's legacy, while Matelda contemplates what is worth fighting for but she is running out of time.

September 12 *Apples Never Fall* by Liane Moriarty

After fifty years of marriage, Stan and Joy Delaney are ready to start what should be the golden years of their lives. One night a stranger named Savannah knocks on Stan and Joy's door. Savannah is bleeding after a fight with her boyfriend, the Delaneys are more than happy to help her. Later, everyone will wonder what exactly went on in that house because now Joy is missing, no one knows where Savannah is.

October 10 *Lessons in Chemistry* by Bonnie Garmus

Elizabeth Zott would be the first to point out that there is no such thing as an average woman. A few years later Elizabeth Zott finds herself not only a single mother but also the reluctant star of America's most beloved cooking show, *Supper at Six*. Elizabeth's unusual approach to cooking proves revolutionary. But as her following grows, not everyone is happy.

November 14 *This Time Tomorrow* by Emma Straub

On the eve of her 40th birthday, Alice's life isn't terrible. She's happy with her apartment, her romantic status, her independence, and she adores her lifelong best friend. But something is missing. When Alice wakes up the next morning somehow back in 1996, she is 16 again. Now armed with a new perspective on her own life and his, is there anything that she should do differently this time around?

December 12 *The Diamond Eye* by Kate Quinn

Given a rifle and sent to join the fight, Mila must forge herself from studious girl to deadly sniper--a lethal hunter of Nazis known as Lady Death. When she becomes a national heroine, Mila finds herself torn from the bloody battlefields of the eastern front and sent to America on a goodwill tour. When an old enemy from Mila's past joins forces with a deadly new foe lurking in the shadows, Lady Death finds herself battling her own demons and enemy bullets in the deadliest duel of her life.
